#### Understanding Word Roots and Parts

Like plants, words start from .

- The word root *gen* means .





<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Added to the <input type="text"/> of a word</li><li>Example: <i>dis-</i> means “the opposite of”</li><li><u>Dis</u>approval</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Added to the <input type="text"/> of a word</li><li>Example: <i>-less</i> means “without”</li><li><u>End</u>less</li></ul>

**Combining Word Parts**

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**How can analyzing word parts and context expand your vocabulary?**

A word is only one  of a sentence.

How a word is used within a sentence can help us  more about the word.

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**Homophones**

Homophones are words that  the same but have different  and , such as *effect* and *affect*.

- Spell-check programs will not catch an improperly used , because the word is not spelled incorrectly.
- To use homophones correctly,  the meanings and spellings of common homophones.

**Distinguishing between Homophones**

Understanding meaning, , and context can help a writer determine the correct  to use.

- Amahl passed the ball to his teammate, setting up the winning basket.
- Amahl wrote about events from his past in his autobiography.

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**Examples of Homophones**
